# *Journey from offline to online*

(A paradigm shift in Education System Due to Covid-19 Pandemic)



The COVID-19 pandemic which rages around the globe, leaving no space untouched, has left a severe impact in the field of education.

By the end of March 2020, the pandemic was everywhere, resulting in the closure of most of the schools, colleges and universities across the globe. 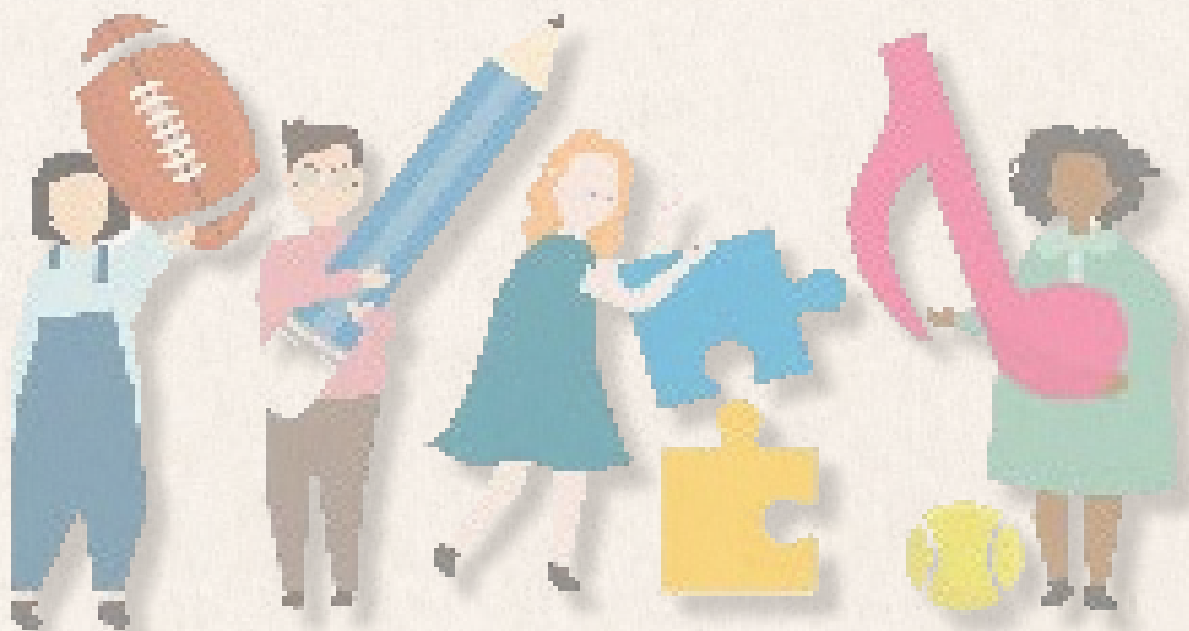
## ACTIVITIES KALEIDOSCOPE 2019-2020 (PRIMARY WING)

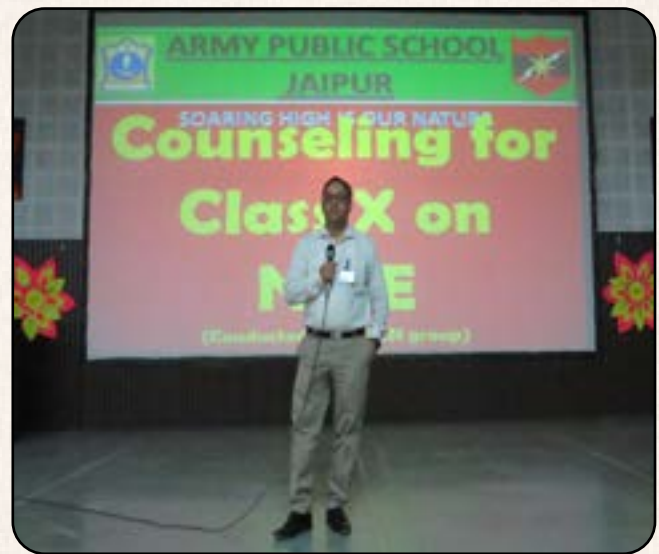
# COUNSELLING REPORT

1. Counselling sessions for the students of classes I to XII were regularly conducted by the School Counsellors in which they were informed about appropriate body language, proper communication skills, confidence building, dressing sense and disciplinary behavioural conduct.
2. A teachers' Induction Programme was organised in the month of May. In this, teachers of both the wings were addressed by the senior teachers and the Administration Department on the topics: Work Ethics and Professionalism. Awareness about rules and regulations of the School was also developed through it.
3. To inculcate the core values of humanity, empathy, social responsibility, interdependence, participatory citizenship and other life skills among students, several visits were organised for students to 'Mother Teresa Old Age Home' and 'Sapta Shakti Asha School'. These visits served as sensitisation opportunities for students as they learned about the difficulties of elderly people, their caretaking, understood the need of love and affection in their lives, the world of special children, challenges faced by them and the preciousness of their loved ones.
4. During In-Service Teachers' Training Programme conducted in the month of May, several counselling seminars were conducted for APS teachers. Some of the topics discussed were: Gender Sensitivity, How to Develop Productivity of Teachers and Students, Activity Based Teaching, How to Make Effective Worksheets, Effective Communication Skills for Teachers. Other sessions were conducted for teachers throughout the year on topics like Role of Teachers in Society and Professionalism.
5. Parents' Counselling Sessions for the classes I to XII were organized during the months of April and August and at regular intervals. Topics of these sessions were Effective Parenting, Virtuous Parenting, Connecting to Rules and Regulations of School, Examination Pattern of CBSE and How to be a Parent Your Child Deserves. Parents participated enthusiastically in these sessions.
6. A remedial counselling session was organised in the month of July for the students of classes III to V on the topic 'How to Overcome Examination Anxiety'.

7. Special motivational counselling sessions were organised for the students of classes X, XI and XII in the month of July by representatives of Indian Army. The sessions explained the life of Padma Bhushan Lt. Gen. Sagat Singh, PVSM (Retd), 'Difficulties of Operation Vijay' and cleared the doubts of students about the process of joining Indian Army and life in Army.
8. An informative parents' counselling session was conducted in the month of August for the aspirants of Sainik and Military schools. Complete details were shared regarding the forms, criteria of filling up the forms, age limits, about residential facilities and reservation policies. Information about the dates of entrance examination, subject related details were discussed.
9. Orientation session was conducted for the parents of class I students and the parents of new students in August to give details of School policies and objectives, School activities, understanding behaviour of students, activities to develop confidence and good communication skills and positive parenting.
10. An informative counselling session was organised by representatives from Akash Coaching Institute for the students of class X to explain details of NTSE exam in the month of August.



11. Regular individual and group counselling sessions were conducted throughout the session for the students, based on their academic performances as well as for various behavioural issues, proper school conduct and to inculcate a sense of equality among students.
12. Various Psychological Tests were administered during the session on the students of classes IX, X, XI and XII to assess various significant aspects of their behaviour and personality. Students actively participated during such assessments.
13. Special counselling sessions were conducted for the parents of students in senior secondary classes. These sessions were addressed by the Chairman and the Principal of the School. The topics of these sessions were: How Parents Can Help to Ensure Academic Progress and Disciplinary Conduct of the Child, Vision of the School for the Students of Higher Classes and How They Can be the Best Parent for their Adolescent children.

14. On 4 Oct 2019, the School invited the special students of Umang School and Sapta Shakti Asha School to enjoy the Dusshera Celebrations with APS Students. Students were accompanied by their Principals Mrs. Deepak Kalra, Mrs. Hema Kumar and other faculty members. This program gave a healthy opportunity to our students to witness the life of such special children closely. They celebrated with presentation of Ramleela, songs and dance. Psychology students of classes XI & XII interacted with these children and shared their happiness.

15. A Counselling seminar for the female students of classes VI and VII along with their mothers was conducted by Mrs. Anuradha Sharma from P&G (PROCTOR & GAMBLE) Organization on 14 Oct 2019. It was an interactive session highlighting and informing about various aspects of developmental changes, health and hygiene, nutrition and growth in female students and their mothers. An informative session on personal health & hygiene and good & bad touch was organised in the months of August and December for the students of classes I to V. This helped them in developing a better sense of health and hygiene, awareness towards their bodily changes and increased their sensitivity towards safety.

16. An informative session was organised for the students of classes III to V in October to help them understand the ways of celebrating safe Diwali, how they can take care of their safety and health during festivals.

17. The Students of class X were taken to visit the fair organised by Sapta Shakti Asha School on 'World Disability Day' in the month of December. They got the opportunity to volunteer and learn about various disabilities and difficulties in the life of differently-abled children. They were also sensitised to understand the need of love, care and affection required by these children.

18. Several Olympiads were organised in the School by SOF (Science Olympiad Foundation) for classes III to XI in September and December. Appreciable number of students appeared in these Olympiads and won gold, silver and bronze medals and other prizes for their outstanding performances at School and Zonal Level.

19. Several career counselling sessions and programmes for developing innovation among students were conducted for the students of classes IX to XII of APS, Jaipur. These were conducted by Mr. Rajesh Gupta from The Institute Of Company Secretaries of India, Jaipur, representatives from Amity University, Jaipur and representatives from NIT, New Delhi and J.K. Lakshmi pat University, Jaipur.

20. Orientation programmes for the students of classes IV and V were organised in the months of January and February to impart values of discipline and to prepare students for senior classes.

21. An interactive and awareness developing two day training program was conducted on 3 and 4 March 2020 by Mrs. Mrinalini Deshpande. The training program for the teachers highlighted the importance of prior preparation by a teacher before entering a class, what are the difficulties faced by the teachers in a classroom and the ways to overcome them. It also helped in understanding the challenges of children with special needs and what can be done for helping them to learn and grow.

## HARMFUL EFFECTS OF POLYTHENE BAGS

“If you can't reuse it, refuse it  
If you can't refuse it then, don't produce it”

Present days, we use polythene products for all purposes in our daily life. Be it for carrying vegetables, milk, fruit, clothes, sweets, or other nonedible items that we use in our day to day lives.

Plastic: A poison:- Polythene bag is a kind of plastic which is non-biodegradable and causes environmental pollution . They undergo a process known as 'Photodegradable' in which they breakdown into smaller toxic particles. Polythene takes upto 1000 years to decompose.

Harmful Effects of Polythene Bags:-The polythene product causes harmful effects to all living things, be it human, animals or aquatic life and environment as well. The main harmful effects are listed below:-

- I. Polythene gets into soil and slowly releases toxic chemicals.
- II. Burning of plastic in open air leads to release of poisonous/toxic chemicals that cause respiratory problems.
- III. Exposure to plastic's toxic chemicals leads to cancer, birth defects and other ailments.
- IV. Plastic reacts with certain food contents and may cause very serious health issues.
- V. Plastic pollution in ocean is a major threat to marine life.

Therefore, we have to take resolution to say 'No' to production, supply and use of polythene at every stage. It is social as well as individual responsibility to eradicate this man-made epidemic. Both the society and the government have to work together in a synchronised manner to stop the production, supply and use of plastic products, especially polythene bags. The government should ban the production of polythene.

We all must think and act to stop the use of polythene to save this beautiful planet from this self created epidemic. We should encourage and promote the use of bags which are made of paper, jute and cloth. 'Prevention is better than cure' – therefore, let's stop using polythene.

## MANGALYAAN

India's Mangalyaan was the first satellite to go to the Mars' Orbit in its first attempt. As India is a developing country, it was unusual that we could do the impossible. The Mangalyaan mission was India's first Interplanetary mission.

It was a proud moment for ISRO and India.

The Mangalyaan satellite was designed with scientific instruments.

These were:

Mars Colour Camera- The camera was electro optical sensor camera. It was 8 mega pixel camera which could click photo in 3 different levels .

Thermal Infrared Imaging Spectrometer- It detected the temperature and hotspot of Mars.

Methane Sensor- It was to only detect methane gas present in the atmosphere of Mars.

Lyman Alpha Photometer- It was an absorption gas cell photometer. Mars Exosphere Composition Analyser (MENCA) which checked the neutral composition of Mars. The distance of Earth from Mars is 54.6 million kilometer that is why Deep Space Network Station got all the photos transmitted from Mangalyaan. Mangalyaan had a weight of 1337 kg and was the first cheapest satellite in the world with the making cost of only 450 crores.

The Mariner 3 of America which failed had a price of rupees 4700 crores. In 1971, Mariner 9 was launched and succeeded, so America became the first country to send the rocket on Mars orbit. Europe in 2003 and 2004 built satellite but failed and same happened with China in 2011. Mangalyaan takes about 72 hours 51 minutes 31 seconds to take a full round of Mars.

It is a great achievement for a developing country like India. I hope our country keeps achieving like this, in the coming years.

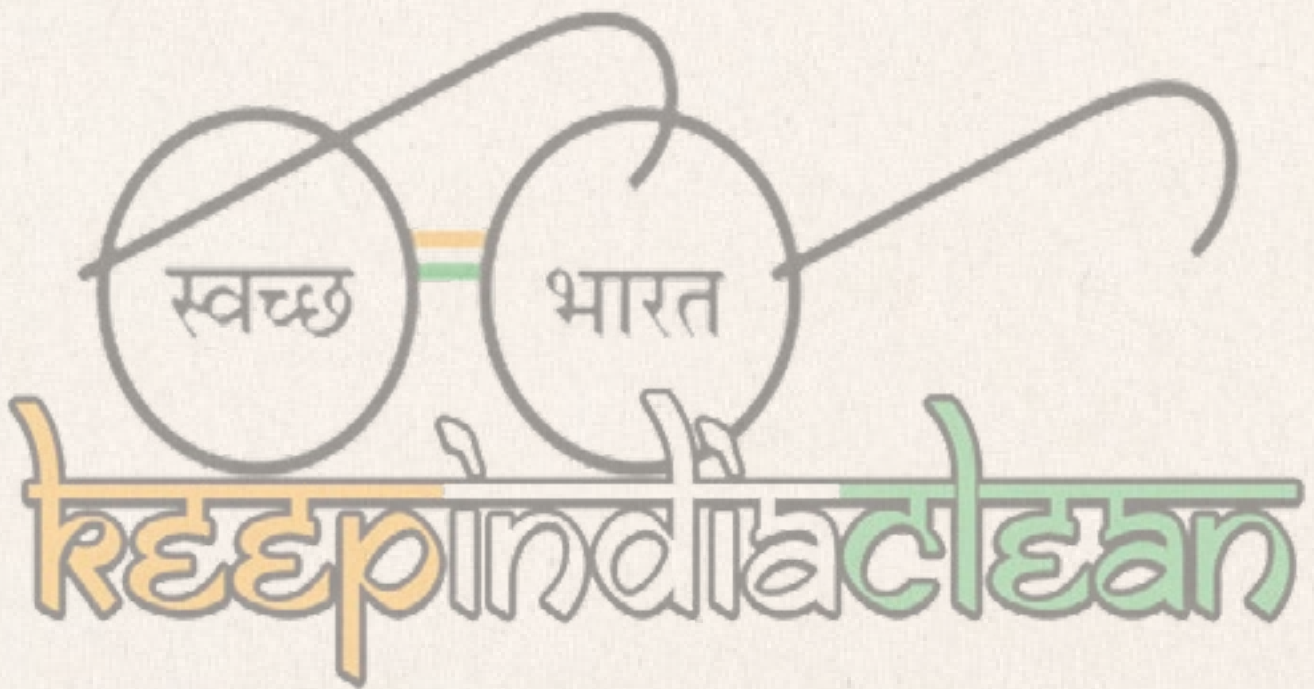
# Swachh Bharat Abhiyan

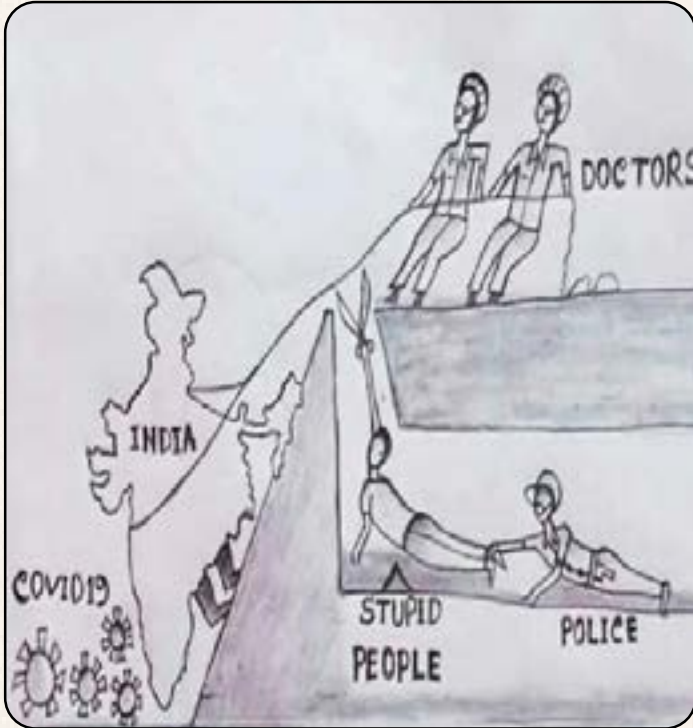

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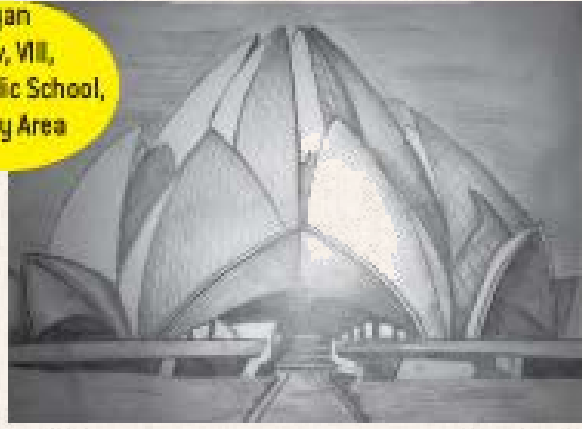
